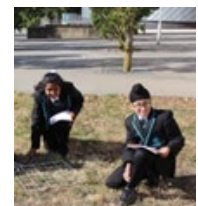
### Year 6 taster days

### No limits curriculum

September saw the launch of an exciting new curriculum aimed at developing the employability and future skills of our year 7 students. The curriculum is aimed at encouraging our students to think outside of the traditional curriculum and prepare them for life in the modern world. The curriculum is divided up into core learning and applied transdisciplinary learning (ATL). During the core learning students continue to study discrete subjects and then through the ATL they will apply what they have learned in the classroom to real-world projects that cross subject disciplines. The students have been working hard in the new ATL room and have completed so many exciting activities so far including investigating the local ecology, building towers, researching their dream careers as well as maths, English and science masterclasses.



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
