GCSE Theatre Visit

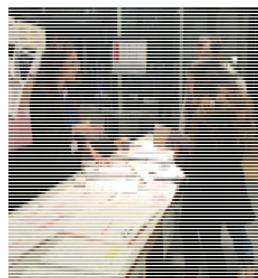
