

<p>What is PPL? Phonographic Performance Ltd</p>	<p>A license that businesses & organisations need to play recorded music in public.....collect money on behalf of performers and record companies for the use of their music.</p> <p>“For example when music is played in a restaurant”</p>
<p>What is PRS? Performing Right Society Limited (PRS)</p>	<p>A license that businesses & organisations need to play music written by songwriters, composers and music publishers for the use of their musical compositions and lyrics.... collect royalties on behalf of their members.</p> <p>“For example when their music is played on TV.”</p>
<p>What is MCPS? Mechanical Copyright Protection Society Limited (MCPS)</p>	<p>A license that businesses & organisations need to reproduce(copy) and distribute(sell) music for products such as CDs, digital downloads and musical toys...collect royalties for songwriters, composers and music publishers, when their music is reproduced and distributed.</p> <p>“For example when a composers sheet music is sold online”</p>
