On Thursday 9th December, Mr David, Director of Student Leadership and Engagement at the Aspirations Academies Trust, visited the Academy to work with a group of Year 7 and Year 8 students on the Aspirations Edge Award. The Aspirations Edge is a programme that provides opportunities for students to demonstrate the Three Guiding Principles (Engagement, Purpose and Self Worth) and Eight Conditions (Belonging, Sense of Accomplishment, Heroes, Fun and Excitement, Spirit of Adventure, Curiosity and Creativity, Leadership and Responsibility and Confidence to Take Action).

The Aspirations Edge Award recognises the work and activities that students participate in both inside and outside of school. It empowers students to follow your dreams and contribute to a society of which we can all be proud. Two students Sara Joshi (Year 7) and Ronnie Brown (Year 8) are the first students ever at Park to achieve the award, and will be presented with their certificates and badges in assembly. A huge congratulations to them both! We are excited to give more students the opportunity to participate in the programme in the new year.




Students were excited to open their results, and there were lots of smiles, including from staff who are so proud of our students and what they have achieved since the start of this year.






PAWL STEM club is a highly motivated and enriching extracurricular club which intends to shift pupil perceptions towards Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. Run every Monday afterschool for pupils from years 7 to 9. STEM club aims Pupils are exposed to how STEM subjects work in action and develop key skills through hands-on STEM challenges.

Our students got up to many exciting challenges this term, such as creating their own stunning scents from scratch. Fragrances are full of science and students delve into the science of manufacturing perfumes as well as applying their scientific knowledge of mixtures and the particle model.

Another fun challenge that our students were stuck into was the magnetic slim challenge. Students saw the wonders of how pressure affects how their slime flowed, its thickness, its softness and its magnetic properties.

We are eager to continue to grow further over the next term, with plans set in motion to guide our students through their first ever long term project to enter into the Crest Reward.

We look forward to welcoming our students back to the STEM club after the Christmas holidays and encourage those who haven't come before to show up and try out our weekly challenges. We will be introducing STEM club passports for our students to collect stickers every time they attend to receive participation rewards.

Charity Committee Update

On Thursday 2nd December, our charity team held a bake sale in aid of Save the Children and Cancer Research UK. We had a wide array of baked good to sell, but a particular shout out is made to Cerys Fisher in Year 12 who baked the most delicious cupcakes for the sale!

The charities were chosen for the following reasons:

Save the Children is an international organisation which works alongside 122 countries. Save the Children's main aim is to ensure children have healthcare, food and shelter, as well as learning and child protection services when children need it most.

Cancer Research is one of the most popular charities within the UK that funds their money to scientists, doctors and nurses to help beat cancer sooner. Their main aim is to reduce the number of deaths from cancer. For every £1 donated, 80p is used to beat cancer (the remaining 20p goes towards raising funds for the future).
