Competition Winners



Aspirations Employability Diploma (AED) by by Akram Abokor and Davide Sanita (both Year 12)

Our latest AED assignment involves us working in teams alongside Cucina to invigorate the canteen menu. We were tasked with creating new innovative menu ideas which were healthy, tasty and cost effective. The assignment launch was delivered by the Cucina Regional Operations Manager and the Cucina in-house chef. We learnt about how the company runs and the different points that they have to consider when planning a menu. Part of the assignment has involved all of Year 12 completing work experience in the canteen to help us understand the processes that the organisation goes through each day in order for them to feed over 800 students and staff each day. We have conducted student voice surveys to gather the feedback from students in different year groups. During the assignment we are developing employability skills which will be useful in the future when we are pursuing our future careers; we have to manage our group and the tasks that we need to complete in order to fulfil the client brief. We are closing in on the final few weeks of the assignment and we are excited to launch our new menu ideas, hopefully they will be loved by all.





Sixth Form Social Event

To conclude a fantastic term for both Year 12 and 13s, the Sixth Formers were rewarded with another social event to unwind and destress from the usual day to day academic life. Travel Smart by TFL

As our Sixth Form students reach 17 years of age, the prospect of learning to drive is very exciting. However, it is important that young people learn how to behave responsibly on the roads. All Sixth Form students participated in TfL's Travel Smart Programme aims to teach road safety skills to 16-19 year olds as they gain further independence as drivers, passengers, moped riders cyclists and pedestrians. Our students participated in interactive workshops where they discussed various scenarios and the impact that difference decisions can have. This is a key invent in our PSHCE programme for our Sixth Formers and the students found the workshops informative.





Sixth Form Well-Being Day

On Friday 2nd December, our Sixth Form students took part in a well-being day. Throughout the day students participated in a range of activities designed to focus on mental health. The students participated in two classes which were led by experts in Yoga and Gong Bath. The teaching was inspired by the precision and grace of Anusara yoga which connects heart, movement and breath. The aspirational purpose is to ignite self inquiry, creativity and exploration through these ancient practices - to encourage healing and transformation.

Students also had motivational talks on Brene Brown, an American professor, lecturer, author, and podcast host. Brown is known in particular for her research on shame, vulnerability, and leadership, and for her widely viewed TEDx talk in 2010. Jay Shetty is an English author, former Hindu monk, and life coach of British Indian descent. As the host of the podcast On Purpose, his guests have included Alicia Keys, Khloe Kardashian, and Kobe Bryant, resulting in over 300 million downloads.

This day aimed to provide students with a range of new experiences to support their well-being. Students thoroughly enjoy the well-being day and one student commented, "I found the well-being day was very relaxing and made everyone open to trying new things."





Subject Areas

An update from the Maths Department

In Maths, Year 8 students have been getting in the festive spirit by creating Christmas trees and stars using curve stitching. Curve stitching is the process of draw a series of straight lines in order to give the illusion of a curve. Students then decorated their trees with baubles and lights.







Religious Studies (RS)

The launch of RS extra-curricular club every Wednesday during break 1 has a splendid turn out this term. Students have participated in a range of presentations, quizzes and debates, and in the last few weeks students have explored the significance of the birth of Jesus and will be in a competition of creating the most creative Christmas cards for their families and teachers at Park Academy.

Students in Years 10-13, have been involved in some deep learning opportunities focusing on themes including criminal law, crime and punishment. We have had the opportunity to invite Becca Kirk from the Widening Participation team at the University of Warwick and the School of Law to deliver a series of workshops on criminal law and the justice system. Students were able to differentiate between a solicitor and barrister and worked through a real crime case in groups and were given the role of either the prosecutor or the defender. The students the participated in a mock trial where they defended their case and this led to a competitive debate. Following this, students were able to express their ideas and have group discussions on the importance of the justice system in the UK and worldwide and developed a range of skills such as communication, confidence and collaboration skills.



STEM Centre at Brunel University

During the last week of term, thirty Year 9 students were selected to visit the STEM Centre at Brunel University. They had a day full of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) activities that challenged students to solve problems by thinking outside the box and using their creativity working in teams to win prizes.

Students were provided a campus tour and a Q and A with STEM ambassadors. This gave students an insight into what life as an undergraduate would look like and find out more about what subjects the university has to offer.

This was an amazing opportunity for our students who gain greater appreciation to why STEM is such an important part of their lives and what doors it can hope to open for them in the future.

Key Stage 3 Girls Football

On Thursday 1st December, the Key Stage 3 Girls football team travelled to Rosedale College to take part in a 4-way tournament with Park Academy, Harlington, and two Rosedale teams. The team were confident but it was still nerve wracking and tense as this was the teams' first competitive experience.

The first game was against Rosedale B and the girls got off to a great start with Amy feeding an excellent cross for Donya to slot home. Another solo effort from Donya made the game safe, and Lily S put the icing on the cake with a clinical strike. 3 - 0 win and playing really well. The signs were great.

The next came was against Rosedale A and the game proved much tougher. A very good goal from Lily in the first half relieved some of the pressure, but the team stood firm with Amy, Vanessa and Grace being excellent in defence. Careers



Brunel Lecture Series

Our Brunel Lecture Series has continued over the past couple of weeks with a focus on Criminology and UK Politics. We have been lucky to have had Dr Ebony Reid talking to some Year 11, 12 and 13 students about Criminology and explored the psychosocial underpinnings of street crime in inner-city London. This was followed by Professor Justin Fisher who spoken about the changing landscape of UK elections

Our students found the lectures engaging, they asked interesting questions and linked some aspects of the lectures to their current learning. The academic staff from Brunel University were impressed with our student's engagement with the topics and have invited them to an open day at Brunel University.

We are hoping to continue to series in the Spring Term.

Year 8 Royal Navy Leadership

As part of our Careers Journey, our Year 7 and 8 students focus on developing skills that they can use, not only as they progress through Park Academy, but as they enter the world of work. The focus for Year 8 is the development of leadership skills. To support in this, the Royal Navy presented to the students and asked them 'what makes s good leader?' The students participated fully in the session which has laid foundations for the follow up workshops in the Spring Term. During these workshops, students will have more hands on opportunities to develop their leadership skills.



Students also learnt about different pathways into the Navy at the end of GCSEs or at the end of A Levels.

Year 11 Futures Interviews

As part of ensuring our Year 11 students are prepared for the next stage of their education, all Year 11 students are invited a meet with a member of the Senior Leadership Team. These appointments provide a valuable opportunity for students to talk about their career aspirations and then explore avenues to how to get there. With so many opportunities available it can be daunting for students, but in these meetings students are can explore and research them with a member of staff. All the appointments have provided a great opportunity to explore the wide range of courses at the varying providers in the local area.

These interviews will continue after the Winter Holidays and are the precursor to the Independent Careers Advisor appointments that all Year 11 students will have.
